Responding to the PANDEMIC and worsening HOUSING CRISIS, we have focused OUTREACH efforts on keeping those we serve HOUSED, HEALTHY, and SAFE. We have provided a variety of HOUSING SERVICES, such as housing unsheltered households, EVICTION PREVENTION including landlord negotiation, CASE MANAGEMENT services such as goal planning and education, and SHELTER DIVERSION to ensure systems are not overwhelmed.

BACKGROUND

Family Promise of Morris County is a nonsectarian, 501(C)(3) nonprofit organization modeled after Family Promise. The model has been replicated nationwide through 200+ partners, involving 200,000 volunteers, and serving over one million families since its founding.

WHO WE ARE

In 1988, Family Promise of Morris County was founded in response to a growing number of families experiencing homelessness in Morris County, NJ. Today, we provide a continuum of services to both families and single individuals through our Shelter, Housing, and Outreach Programs. Program components include a drop-in resource center, a mobile outreach van, 24/7 on-call support to those we serve and our landlords, and most recently, affordable, shared housing for single women.

Our Rapid Rehousing & Diversion Program (RRHD), launched in early 2021, is an expansion of our existing Housing Programs, adapted to better serve our community's current needs.

Rapid Rehousing helps individuals and families move into safe, stable housing quickly. Diversion plays an integral role in this process, as it provides monetary, systematic, and interpersonal interventions that help community members avoid the shelter system entirely. These services are inherent to what we do as an agency.

By providing more in-depth services in this area, the program can better serve our guests, landlords, and the community as a whole.

RRHD supports our vision of Housing is Healthcare for our community, as public and economic health remain at the forefront.

The pandemic made clear how difficult it is to maintain our health without a safe space to call home.

Housing is Healthcare works to ensure that everyone in our community has access to safe shelter and affordable housing—both of which are fundamental to one's health and well-being.

Housing instability and homelessness have damaging health consequences that can last lifetimes, impacting not only adults but their children and generations thereafter.

Those experiencing homelessness are more likely to suffer from substance use disorder, mental health conditions, food insecurity, and heart disease (Network for Public Health Law).

A lack of health insurance and use of emergency room care as a primary healthcare source leads to increased healthcare costs for families, individuals, and the community as a whole.

Addressing one's housing needs not only increases their health, ability to maintain employment, and quality of life, but the overall well-being of a community for future generations to come.

CARES FUNDING INFORMATION

We were awarded funding via the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, which enabled further expansion of our Rapid Rehousing and Diversion (RRHD) services into a full-fledged program.

Allocated toward direct client services, these ONE TIME CARES ACT monies awarded us the greatest influx of public funding in our 33-year history to permanently house 38 individuals at a 100% success rate. Our CARES funding will soon come to an end, we are excited to continue this essential work while seeking new avenues for support.

OUR PROGRAMS

Family Promise of Morris County's mission is to mobilize community resources and people to end the crisis of homelessness and housing insecurity faced by families and individuals by providing a continuum of services leading to self-sufficiency.

We have proudly served our community for 30+ years and are committed to improving overall housing, economic, health and wellness outcomes in Morris County.

Our programs provide shelter, housing, rental assistance, eviction prevention, diversion and prevention, outreach, education, and care management to individuals and families who are currently experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity, those who are precariously housed, and those who formerly experienced homelessness.

SHELTER

Emergency Shelter Program: Since 1988, we've partnered with 75+ local congregations and a network of 1,600+ volunteers to provide overnight shelter, meals, crisis intervention, linkages to vital services, like health & wellness, and permanent housing acquisition.

Motel Sheltering Program: During the COVID-19 pandemic, we transitioned to a motel sheltering model to keep guests and staff safe.

Coordinated Entry: Provides housing navigation to those awaiting shelter or permanent housing.



HOUSING

Community Support Program: Supports those who have graduated from our programs, leaving other shelters, using local food pantries and drop-in centers, and who are on the verge of homelessness.

Keys to Housing: Our housing voucher program that works in partnership with various local, regional, and federal agencies to provide housing solutions.

Promising Solutions: Provides safe, affordable, shared housing for single women experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity in our community.

OUTREACH

Our Promise Drop-in Center: Our daytime resource center located in the First Baptist Church in Morristown provides respite from weather, a mailing address, donations, benefits screenings, and case management to low-income neighbors experiencing homelessness.

Navigating Hope: Our mobile outreach unit increases access to a variety of programs and services across all 39 Morris County municipalities.

RAPID REHOUSING & DIVERSION

Rapid Rehousing: Quickly connects families and individuals experiencing street homelessness, housing instability or living in the shelter system to housing in the community.

Diversion: Leverages resources to help families and individuals that are facing imminent homelessness divert the shelter system entirely by helping them maintain housing.


